






Inquiry Based Learning



The essence of inquiry-based learning is that students participate in the planning, development and evaluation of projects and activities. Techers can take many approaches to crafting an inquiry-based project, but Dr. Cornelia Brunner of the Center for Children and Technology breaks it into four main parts: Posing Real Questions, Finding Relevant Resources, Interpreting Information and Reporting Findings.



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Do's and Don'ts for YEOTY




- 1. Choose a topic that is relevant to economics and that you are interested in.
- 2. Find and select information from reliable sources. E.g. use the RESEARCH TOOL in Google Docs and Google Presentation. Click on the TOOLS toolbar and select RESEARCH. You will then be able to search for information and images at the right hand side of the screen.
- 3. Reference all sources of information, images and video clips.
- 4. Plan your presentation before you start to create it.
- 5. Choose a presentation tool that is suitable for the message you want to get across and the type of information that you have. Note: the accuracy and relevance of the content is more important than a flashy presentation.
- 6. Try and move up Bloom's Taxonomy of Thinking (see next page) in your presentation e.g. demonstrate and understanding of a concept/topic, apply it to real life, analyse it from the positive and the negative etc.
- 7. Use few words and relevant images. E.g. use the recording function in Powerpoint to explain a point rather than writing about it word for word.
- 8. Set high standards for yourself regarding punctuation and grammar.
- 9. Draft, proofread, edit, proofread, edit..... until it is perfect. Get a friend to give a second opinion.
- 10. Look for constructive criticism and feedback.
- 11. Be creative.
- 12. Have fun!



- 1. Choose a topic that has no relevance to economics.
- 2. Use information from unreliable sources.
- 3. Use information, images, video clips without acknowledging the source.
- 4. Launch into your presentation without planning.
- 5. Use an inappropriate presentation tool. i.e. if your project involves a lot of words/reading there is no point in putting it into a video clip that is too fast to read.
- 6. Just recall information or give one sided arguments or analysis.
- Overdo it on too many words or visuals.
- 8. Assume that punctuation and grammar are not important they are!
- 9. Depend on your teacher to proofread your work.
- 10. Be afraid of criticism or feedback.
- 11. Be boring.
- 12. Be worried.


